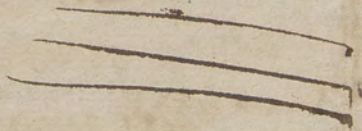
Dear Brother

 objections but I shal want come with anything like terms

 stay upon my account for Jeremiah seems unwilling to  
 go to monthly meeting and I resolve not to go any other  
 way some have been pleased to say that it is because  
 I am in love with James Logen because I lodged there  
 for too or three nights when I was in town bee pleased

 may make that the reason thou may recoll them thou  
 knows to the contrary but say nothing of thy reason
