I woud have thee if thou thinke convenient to go that week
to Asquith, & know her mind that as we may not be put by it
want but if she will stay I woud be thinking as willingly
she should stay as go for I see nothing but very handsome
about the house & in my thoughts more handsome than when
Thomas was there, except the hedge she says she will
stay if she can agree wth Ayres for some of his
grounds, the landlady was here last week & was desirous to
have thy answer whether thou woud sell the mill or not
I told her thou woud be over ere long & then she should know
I have not all but love only An is much out of order she
has been waked wth 2 nights but this morning was desirous
to come hither & is now here & is rather better, Jam
