The 20<sup>th</sup> of mo 1600

These are to acquaint thee that I have drawn the substance  
of my & Peter Colbourne Contract about the house & I would  
have Marjory to put her hand to it, I believe I have so re-  
worded it that what I said to him, but include so much as  
I have written but if Marjory believe that I have worded it  
more fully then the bargain betwixt us be put forth what  
ever it be, I can not say for those were my own words but  
I believe that what I said will include all those words  
Margaret Bradley says that William Highfild desired her to speak  
to me to persuade thee to sell him thy house, I told her that if  
Mary left it thou wast otherwise engaged to F. G.  
And she was there & look too to a side & says they have  
Agreed to come to it & would faine have an Answer  
shortly I told her Mary would be at Hadfield bridge about  
2 weeks end & would give her Answer & she then should have  
an answer as quickly as we told after, & we had her Answer  
I do not understand if F. G. & F. G. place will be very suitable  
for Mary & so I sent Mary word in Bradley first day  
that Hugh Windley was here 3 day night & his wife & Peter Worthing  
son & was seem to be mighty curious of what he saw  
about an house & he seems to be extraordinary desirous  
of the mill but I kept off as if thou matterd not selling  
it but I would speak to thee & the first time thou wast out  
he should have thy Answer if Worthing spoke much in thy com-  
mendations what an honest man thou wast & how much be-  
low thee, little as it may be out of order & had got a swelling  
in her neck, if he would be but indifferent & I not overwell  
it, I believe I may be at Non woods first day next  
fuller in law killed a cow this week & we took a quarter &  
she be laid by 2 or 3 good pieces w<sup>ch</sup> we thought would be  
suitable for thee & have sent them not all but some & by  
I am thine
