Dear friend and Bro: in Bowels of my
heavenly father, send I dearly salute thee, my
will be send in the Lord, my servants I desire
as to the Lord for thee, that thou and all
the Lords people may be preserved faithful
unto the end, for the reasons if they shall
be saved, that they count with the Lord
for I have heard that thy breathings be to the
Lord that thou may be kept, in the gift of
life, which the god of life hath breathed in
to our souls, by which we are made living
unto the Lord, to worship him in the land of
the living, in which we have living refresh-
ment, flowing as a river and joy as an mighty
stream, and thou blessed will thou be for ever
and all thy undertakings, and thy vine shall
not cast her fruit, before her time, and thy
fields shall yield her increase, and thy cities
and shall sit about thy table as doves
and grow as the cedar, and blossom as the rose
in cedars wood, and as willows by the
water brooks, and as plants in a pleasant
field, which the Lord hath planted, and he
will water them ever moment, and he
will be a tender father, unto them, and give them
the former, and the latter rain, and cause the
dew of heaven to rest upon them, and the
showers of his love to distill, as pleasant dews
and this is the Lords own doing blessed be his
name for ever, faith my friends, who hath be-
wailed it unto his servant, for with my dear
love to thee, and thy dear wife father and mother
and all dear friends I rest who am thy friend
in the truth
