send any goods, for I intend to Cap up shop this  
next weeke, & if possible put by sending my  
next weeke, let me know what thou canst  
not be w<sup>th</sup> out, & we must endeavor to get  
some small quantities of G. sory by some that  
comes on market day, & the other weeke it  
will be hard for thee to go because I must go  
to Liverpool for I am out of goods severall  
sorts, but if we can <sup>the</sup> more of my matter  
I believe thou may for I shall have all my  
moneys I think by that time of my own, as may  
some of the p<sup>ts</sup> of Cloy is already com<sup>ing</sup> from  
Jon; gibson but thou may tell me that  
Jon writes he has ~~no~~ no moneys from  
Tho: what aham not all, but shall expect  
to have more of thy m<sup>oneys</sup> on 2<sup>nd</sup> day the  
child<sup>ren</sup> have been out of order but are  
now much better my love to thee is all  
at present but G. I am thy loving son  
love is to thee
