 d I came over now into the city -
 I am very well blessed be the name
 of the Lord, I write to thee from Bristol
 desiring thee, to send me some health -
 I hope it is come to thy hand, I hope
 to see thee, here, yester day morning
 my horse & pillion, and I and Jo: moon
 of Bristol, was coming out of Malvern
 now, a bout six of the clock, and we
 had not sent a bow: 4: miles but were
 met: 3: lay way men, and Jo: Hay:
 being about: 2: or 3 Road before Jo:
 moon, and me, in an open place -
 the rest so quiet, and one of them -
 did meet Jo: and: 2: met me, and about
 a horse length or: 2. stoart, the best man
 stand, and I had a sight of them I
 was prepared, and blast to my
 horse, and brake thron, and quirted
 my self, and Jo: was taken and
 all he had, but we are all well
 now, blessed be the name of the
 Lord for with my love to you all
