We had a pious & holy meeting of life flow'd out all like a flood

J. Story took a good while who began y^e meeting not bedding and qu^d
gathered & then friends had a good time, & when the meeting should
break up to give ^{themselves} in short y^e meeting ended not well on y^e 4th day
then on y^e 5th day with Rodg^r sent a challenge to friends to show their
reasons for speaking ag^t his book calling us professors of truth, and
it was held y^e 6th day from 6 in y^e morning to about 5 at evening, at
charges ag^t him was not ended, & there was about 30 y^e in his
