I have not seene the agreement but if it be as John tells me how can money be raised for debts and legacies without the stock and servants be disposed of and concerning a barne will half the produce of this place be the barne and find robin cloathes I cannot see that it will I am not willing there should be anye intres upon my account nor as little as can be upon any others for it is a thing these few lines are the second consideration I thought to had the sheep but we shall not differ a few lines from the
