deare friend and well belov'd brother in the vntcha-  
ngable truth of our god I doe most dearly salute  
thee, and I mbrace thee in the armes of everlasting  
love, which neither sea nor land can separate  
vs in Christ Jesus our Lord, and in this love I dearly  
begin thee to remember mee to thy deare wife son and son  
ghator, whom thou writest whom by these thou  
may understand we are verie well every way  
blessed by the name of the Lord, that day that thou  
left vs, at groenewich we told shipping about the  
middle of the day, and we were sailed at boord  
on the next day, about foure in the after noon: for  
we were about 28: honours upon the sea, and were  
both well in health, we had a meeting at Rotterdam  
on the 4 day, and at Harlem on the 6: day and  
at Amstordam y<sup>e</sup> after day, and finding our journey  
ally well, and was glad of vs, the yearly meeting  
beginns the next fift day which is the 16: of this  
instant, and when the meeting is over I thinke  
we may take our journey towards free Land, and  
for as the Lord shall order, for with our own  
love to our deare friend Susannah Miller and  
Jo: Hall and his wife, and John Whittred and  
his wife, Mary Elson and her husband, and  
all friends at home remember, that I require  
after vs, for I rest thy friend and brother according  
to measure and bids thee fare well  
Roger Hendricks remember  
his deare love to thee and  
friends
