## Circulation Desk



As you enter the library from the Student Union Entrance, the Circulation Desk is more than a place to check out books. Students can check out anatomy models, use the scanning station, or get help to book a group study room. They can browse new books on display or get assistance locating items on the shelf or in the ARC.

## Automated Retrieval Center (ARC)



The Automated Retrieval Center is where the library stores almost the entire collection of books and other print materials. These items are stored in four-story tall rows of bins retrieved by a robotic arm. Books are requested on the library website and picked up at the Circulation Desk.

When you enter the library from the fountain entrance, to the right is a coffee shop where students can recharge. Food and drink is allowed in the library.



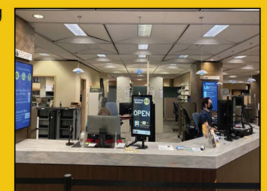
## Study Rooms

One of the busiest places in the library has nothing to do with books! The LibTech desk offers a wide variety of tech equipment and accessories to support students. Laptops, iPads, Apple Pencils, 4K&HD Cameras, mobile device chargers, projectors, and calculators are just a few of the more popular items available to be borrowed. The staff also provides basic tech support and printing assistance to students in the library.

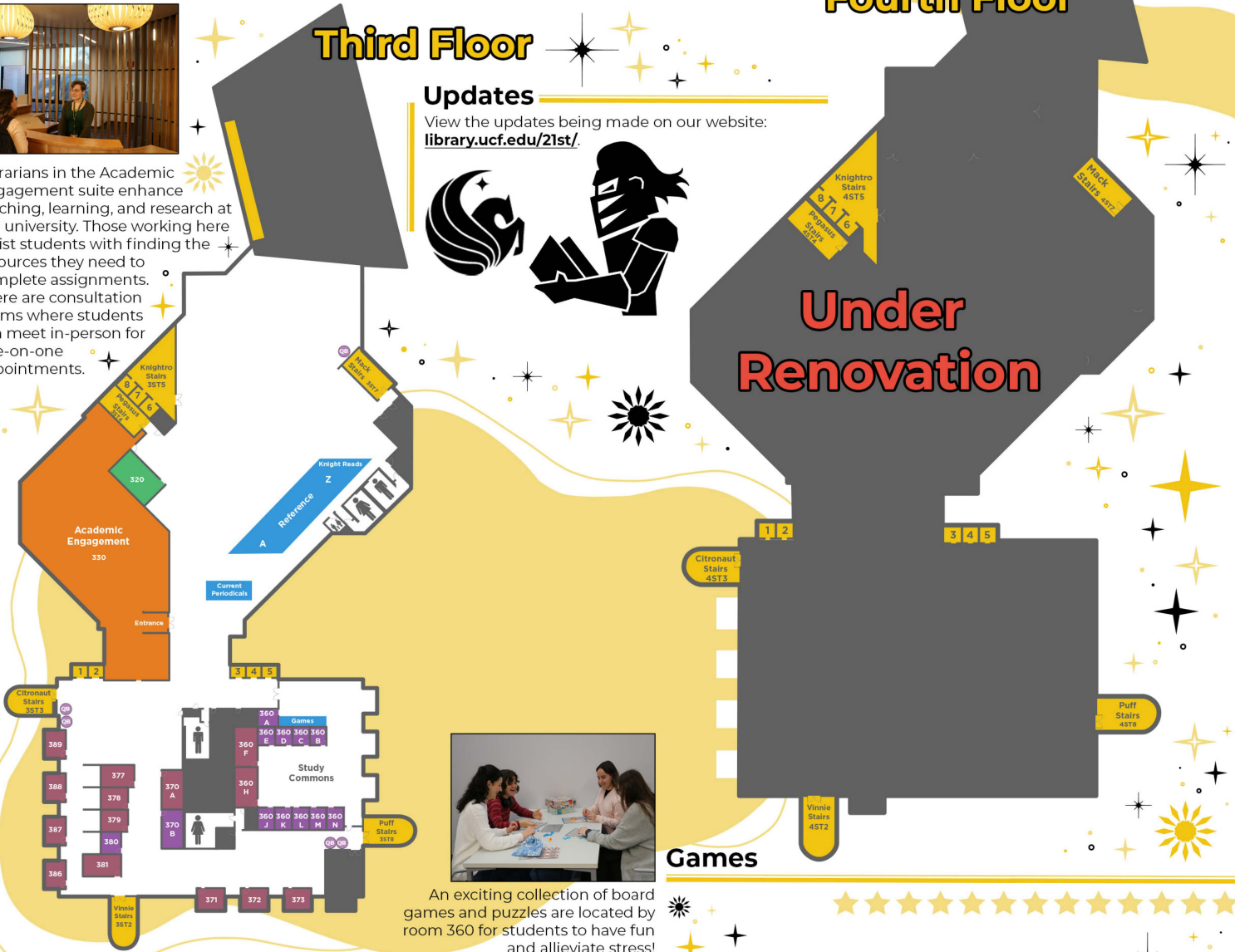
