In much reverence & dearneſſe of love which the Lord in  
his great love hath raised in my heart which  
is beyond expreſſion out <sup>of</sup> ~~my~~ <sup>the</sup> ~~heart~~ which  
doth feel & enjoy mee in doe I dearly ſalute thee  
with thy dear ſon & daughter & little ones dear  
by theſe thou muſt know that we are every way  
throughout the Lords providence which we daily witness  
blessed be his holy name forever: my husband  
hath his dear love remembered to you all: we parted  
with him the 3 of this month at John preſton of  
ſicell hee bad mee remember his dear love to  
thee & lett thee know that hee was well & intended  
for London as ~~ſoon~~ <sup>ſoon</sup> as hee could conveniently  
our dear love to all friends with thee as if I ſhould  
them I deſire to know whether ſhia be ſet with  
cloth for a waſtkote as ſoon as I may be my love to  
ſave & as ſoon as I can tell her that I have long  
deſired that ſhe may doe well & ſerve them  
that ſhe dwells with <sup>in</sup> ſingleneſſe of heart & pure  
where that ſhe may ~~escape~~ <sup>escape</sup> gods judgement  
which others brings upon them by their ungodly  
way being I was much troubled at a letter ſhe  
ſent to her father wherein ſhe ſent her  
word ſhe would not go into the new plantation  
nor have her ~~sister~~ <sup>sister</sup> with which I ~~take~~ <sup>take</sup> very ſtrange  
from her for I had bin at great <sup>change</sup> with her I  
could doe ~~less~~ <sup>less</sup> but lett thee know: alſo I had a  
great deal to have written to thee concerning  
Hedoe & Elnor Lee But it is ſumthing ~~removed~~  
becauſe I expect to ſee her <sup>very ſoon</sup> ~~very ſoon~~ in the  
minds of ſum then they can be concerned  
there proceeding I ſhall not ſay



any that is doubtful: if they find freedom  
 I judge it very servicable so that I can give them  
 no account at present when we shall go I do much  
 desire to see you I hope I shall have opportunity  
 I understand in this business asents thou cannot come  
 over so I have my confidence in the Lord that as  
 we both in his great love preserved in all our  
 exercises: who him only do I commend my  
 self with thee all the Lord children I desire  
 to hear from thee I am in haste
