In much reverence & dear ness of love which the Lord in
his great love hath raised in my heart which
is beyond expression out ^{of} my heart which
doth feel & joy in me in doe I dearly salute thee
with thy dear son & daughter & little ones dear
by these thou must know that we are every well
throughout the Lords providence which we daily witness
blessed be his holy name forever: my husband
hath his dear love remembered to you all: we parted
with mine the 3 of this month att John presston of
ficcil he hath me remember his dear love to
thee & left thee know that he was well & intended
for London as ^{suddenly} as he could conveniently
our dear love to all friends with thee as if I were
them I desire to know whether he be fitted with
cloth for a waistcoat as soon as I may be my love to
save & as thou art I tell her that I have long
desired that she may do well & serve them
that she dwells with ⁱⁿ singleness of heart & pure
words that she may escape gods judgement
which others brings upon them by their ungodly
walsing I was much troubled att a letter she
devoted to her father wherein she sent her
word she would not go into the new plantation
nor have her ^{sister} with which I hope very ^{by} I find
from her for I had bin att great ^{with} her ^{her}
could do ^{me} less but lett thee know: also I had a
great deal to have written to thee concerning
Heddoe & Elnor Loe But it is something ^{because}
because I expect to see her ^{very} ^{much} ^{more} in the
minds of some then they can be ^{concerning}
there proceeding I doubt not but

any that is doubtful: if they find freedom
 I judge it very reasonable to see if I can give the
 no account at present when we shall go I do much
 desire to see you I hope I shall have opportunity
 I understand in this business absent you cannot come
 over so I have my confidence in the Lord that as
 we both in his great love & preservation in all our
 exercises: with him only do I commit my
 self with these all the Lord children I desire
 to hear from thee I am in haste
