My wellbelov'd faithfull & approved friend; unto
tho' streamer my love, in y^e life of righteousness; &
tho' fresh greetings of my life, are unto thee, in y^e
covenant of Light; whom I can truly say, my soul
dearly lov'd, and a real respect for thee, and it
honourable of thee, I have had for monthes & yeares
& it cometh nigh me to conclude, of parting wth thee,
& y^e rest of yo: my wellbelov'd friends, yet do freely
reign yo: up; & leave yo: in y^e will of y^e lord; who's
p^rson I believe will be wth yo: and his blessings
upon yo: wth way soe'er yo: go; my heart is on love
to wth love to yo: all; whom I reckon as one man,
upon whom y^e glory of y^e crown of y^e unity resteth; I
have y^e full unity wth yo: life, w^{ch} is but one; & pure
fellowship wth yo: spirit, w^{ch} are of one; & my life &
love, grows & salutes yo: one by one; my breathings
are to y^e lord for yo:; that blessings every way may
fall upon yo:; y^e Angel of his glory be wth yo: go
before, & attend yo: evermore; Amen; Dear Phinotus
I had given thee a return before this, but y^e p^rson
desir'd & undertook to give thee that amount; how things
appeared in y^e opening of y^e matter; & also wth p^rson willing
wth thou should have a considerable place; & y^e store
keep^r mount; w^{ch} amount thou having received
from Reg^r, I was now free to disquiet in silence
until I had as fully as I could inform my self;
& now I may add that although it be not fully

is intended for thee; very affectionately did wth p^rson
towards thee in y^e discourse of y^e matter; & concluded
thou should have a good place; & oth^r y^e returned
in y^e society giving credit to thy Capableness only
