My wellbeloved faithfull & approved friend; unto
the streamer my love, in thy life of righteousness; &
the fresh greetings of my life, are unto thee, in thy
covenant of light; whom I can truly say, my soul
dearly loves, and a real respect for thee, and it
honourable of thee, I have had for months & years
& it comes nigh me to conclude, of parting with thee,
& I root of yo: my wellbeloved friend, yet do freely
reign yo: up; & leave yo: in thy will of thy lord; whose
p. I believe will be with yo: and his blessings
upon yo: in way soon. yo: go; my heart is on long
to be low to yo: all; whom I reckon as one man,
upon whom I glory in. Crowned with unity & edelth; I
have forth with yo: life, which is but one; & pure
fellowship with yo: spirit, which are of one; & my life &
love, growth & saluter yo: one by one; my breathings
are to thy lord for yo: that blessings every way may
fall upon yo: thy Angel of his glory be with yo: go
before, & attend yo: evermore, Amen; Dear Phineas
I had given thee a return before this, but it is
desired & undertook to give thee about. How things
appeared in thy opening of thy matter; & also w. p. willing
ness thou should have a remarkable place; & thy store
keep. I mentioned; which I thought thou having received
from Reg. I was now free to disquiet in silence
until I had as fully as I could inform my self;
& now I may add that although it be not fully
set down it shall be so; yet it is plain; or a best

I spoke to w. p. of it, he liked well of it but left it to
you of thy society concerned; as to thy chair I desired
not to buy it, chiefly because, if left chair is too
little. I have bought 2 how at London; so you may
take thy chairman; but if no chairman; then leave
it with Broth. Henry, let him give thee 15. & return
of it something or nothing as the pleasure is. Dear love
