But that our Roger Bradshaw is dead and was
buried in amigety great sheak and pompe the
lyto was never seen in the north part of England
and so being vary glad to hear of yo. good health
and well fair wite the good god continow to yo.
and us all forst Thy ffrend John Winstanley
