my dear
 I very sorely salute thee, w^{ch} a kiss of love thou art
 very near me often in my remembrance; but I hope all is
 well w^{ch} the 4 our little ones who are also dear to me; my love
 flows very largely to you all; give my dear love to my father
 when thou sees him; I desire my father write to thee from
 Sasafraz & acquainte thee how things had been w^{ch} him w^{ch} to
 his stay behind us; we arrived at the head of Bohemian Bay the
 last of August or week, & by reason of the snow that fell the
 day following we did not gett any early to some of severall
 days so that we stayed there untill the last 2nd day after
 we brought the best of our goods to that place & came also
 w^{ch} there in the way father our look us & stayed at that
 place 2 nights, & it being that morning towards new Cape the
 skimmer to make w^{ch} us there, the sloop we are to go w^{ch} was
 from that place it not com^{ing} w^{ch} yet but it expect^{ed} in w^{ch}
 hour the mate is gone down the brook in a Canoo to see
 if he can make w^{ch} it; I have pt to write Berry 7 8 to
 be given to the w^{ch} if thou hast occasion make up of it the
 keep it; I have also sent by him a p^{er} of shoes for Betty
 I w^{ch} how he remem^{ber} for my advice on my last winter stays
 w^{ch} the sloop untill the mate come back from new Cape
 I think to write to thee again by w^{ch} Berry about our love, to
 grand mother to Lydia & Betty to w^{ch} Berry & wife to
 Howard Powell & the rest of friends there away; I have write severall
 letters to friends in England but am concerned how to gett
 them away for I am unwilling to give them to any of the men
 & I know of no other opportunity at present I w^{ch} send them to thee
 to be sent away; if I thought I could gett them from thee if thou
 send^{est} them not; for how is Charles just now but he goes to Holland
 w^{ch} his tobacco; I thought much I had not from thee by Thomas
 w^{ch} not none of these friends w^{ch} him but it may be they
 know not of their being downe or if thou did had not the
 opportunity of gettingt a letter to them, I desire thee to miss no
 opportunity of sending to me but lett know from thee w^{ch} often
 w^{ch} thou canst I have mist none of sending to thee w^{ch} yet that
 I know of I write to thee from Sasafraz w^{ch} I suppose will
 be w^{ch} thee in 3 or 4 day. The horse I bid on w^{ch} found
 again & brought home I have 16, I suppose thou may
 have of it also but lett thou not make no mention of
 gain concern^{ing} for thee to know how thou gett^{est} for wood
 to have thou gett^{est} your grand mother body my mother down
 here w^{ch} to thee & she had a concern for thee she had na
 been very well but if now better; I have been much
 well but now & then a little drest & dyed
