to Lett his understanding whether the Land of it self be as good joyful
and as fruitful as the Reports were of it when thou wast in England
and whether thou hast taken up that parcel of Land which I have

wee at firste there we likewise desire to know of thee what thou
thinkst or knowst to be the best commodities for us to bring out
and what time might be the best and shutable for us to be there and
to what place might be the convenient to bring ourselfe to Land
to Land there and likewise if there be any thing else that we
shd not chiquinted with for the present that might be usefull for
us that thou wouldst not fail but Lett us know by thy next and
best opportunity for our whole intent and purpose is to over
in to Pennsylvania this next Spring there fore my desire is that
I might hear from thee that I might have time to furnish
my selfe with conveniences for my Journey for having now
now all present but my dear Love with my wife to thee
