The 10th day of the 3rd mo 1670

My deare I want much to be with thee I have
 had no pleasure since I came to town; things
 go heavily on here about our publick affairs
 w^{ch} makes my stay undesir^d; but doubt it
 will be long ere I come home for we
 have done little as yet, let cozins know
 that I w^old have them as soon as they
 can after the house is up to get the
 weather boards made; I have no acc^t
 as yet whether the shir^lghts be come
 to Burckingham; when the stonework
 is finished let all hands go to grubbing
 Geo: & James knows where that a
 little may be made ready for barley
 afore we go to mowing I sh^old have
 been glad to have had a few lines from
 thy hands by any that had come down
 I told cozins Gos: that Dan Gardiner had
 sent the bond to the ma^r Clark to be
 put in suite agt him & told Clark I w^old
 not trust him nor enter any action w^oth
 out ready money he told me he w^old not
 proceed in it untill the latter end of this
 month I told him the money w^old be ready
 at Court this w^{ch} w^oth my endeared love to thee
 my deare do exp^ris I am with the same thine
