and diligent in thy place doing thy service with an
eye to the Lord who requirith faithfullnes & thereby
thou wilt obtaine his blessings and favor with thy me
& my and a good name every where it shall be known
all way if thou continuest upright to the Lord will make
thee temporally & eternally happy this is the best of
portions & estate its permanent & lasting through time
& eternitie & will stand thee in great stead when
trials & afflictions may attend,
I hope I am on the wrong my hand but its very poor
ly yet am rather better than heretofore
I have got my sheep from the River side have few
oaks shall want 20 bus: of bran I have proatched
with John fatyor to bring it up if thou wilt put it up
in your baggs I shall returne them to the mill shortly
or where thy farm ordered I desire that I might
unpurchased here in it will dome a great kindness &
give John trouble in puting it in the boole nor flaying
for it I shall likewise want 3 or 4 bushells of
lime if it tot to be put in some old bay or cask &
procured for me it will likewise do well but if
it cannot be with out my trouble then let it alone
Speake to James Cooper that he get our flound done
in 3000 ad he can & when done do thou take care
to send it or speedily we want it
Abigail is comen home all our love to thee its all
from thy loving father but love to thy me & my
P. P. om Boston
