 as you keep your integrity, the Lord will
 found them, in their own imaginations, for you
 your trust in the Lord, who will stand by you
 and spread your cause, with his and your own
 money, well I can heart my Lord flows forth
 as a river of living water, but I cannot in-
 large at this time I had me in that which was
 before words, I shall give thee a short ac-
 count of our travell in the south of Germany
 we went first to Strassburg, that is a place where
 there is a new gathering of friends, and we had
 very good fortunes, it is but about two years
 since they had a meeting, and now they are about
 20: on a first day, from thence we went up to
 the Speltzberg and there we had a fine time with
 friends and took our leave of them, in much
 brotherly of heart, and two friends came along
 with us, to a little called Olfersa where we
 were to appear before the magistrates, and to ge-
 account of our business in that country, and
 when we came before them the were merry
 and said we must stay there till they had sent
 to the prince but we might be at our home and
 we might have the liberty of the city: and that
 day the prince sent for us a gain to come be-
 fore them, and he had a gift with them and
 took our commendation, and said we must yet
 stay till answer came from the prince but we

must have the same liberty as had, and we were sent to
 were set at liberty and came to Strassburg and we were well received
 the name of the Lord my commendation I am to thee and all
 heart we are thy friend David Longworth
