100 acres of land lying into Robt Hall being husband
of Edmund Lovel of whom the wife of the said Pike had
information of him in his life time that he had some
acquaintance why you caused me being great why that
when my husband dyed to now make Robt to do so
you would be so kind as to look into the thing if
seeing a thing so of a buy would do you would send
me word by the first opportunity that do you present
if god permit I will endeavor to come with all
my family to make a settlement if you find me
word of encouragement of the certainty of
buy of the same and for your so doing you
will ever oblige your friend to my power

Mary Pike at the request of Geo: Hoagwood there was
in answer to the above there was one Ralph Smith
made a will & dyed & gave to his sister Susannah Pike
his apparel &c: & was delivered to her husband
order he also ordered 100 acres of land he planned
about to be sold and the money to be divided between
his said sister Susannah Pike & his sister Jane Loyd
there was no thing done upon the land as to call it a
plantation for in the inventory it was but
valued at 6⁰⁰ and it was after word sold for 12
with an intent that the money should have gone to his
sister's accord my to his will but the debt was
forced to pay debts with it there was some small matter
got of his but there is a man demands more than
is in hand who is gone for England & not yet returned
that Geo: Pike if he was the husband had been
fully informed of every thing what was to
to say he had seen a plantation I know not for the
account I have heard given him divers times of the
buy of what is about I have now out of the
inventory & sale of the land all being now
before me as also the account of the buy
was all at present from the friends
