DIAMOND'S HIDDEN GEMS



UCF Downtown Library

Depending on your major, it is possible that you may have to take classes away from the UCF main campus. As a Hospitality Management student, for example, once you are accepted into the program, some of your degree classes will be located at the Rosen campus. As students of these campuses, you have access to their respective resources.

I intend to introduce you to each campus library. In this part, we will be discussing UCF's Downtown campus and the Addition Financial Downtown Campus Library.

UCF Downtown is in the heart of Orlando — it acts as a hub for arts, culture, nightlife and business. You can walk from class to an Orlando City soccer game then to the Dr. Phillips Center for the Performing Arts in a span of minutes.

Students studying at UCF Downtown benefit from renovated classrooms in the Dr. Phillips Academic Commons building. UCF Downtown has labs, a Maker Space and other specialized technology areas in the Communication and Media Building, which also has a motion capture studio and sound stage. In addition, the campus provides lounge areas, health and wellness, and advising services.





Similar to the UCF main library, the Addition Financial Downtown Campus Library provides important services to students, faculty, and staff.

Services include:

- Checkout of books, DVDs, and course reserves
- Access to electronic resources, including databases, electronic books, journals, and videos
- Printing, copying, and scanning
- Research assistance via consultations, online chat, phone, text or email
- Borrowing from other libraries via Interlibrary Loan
- Library Instruction and access to subject librarians

Downtown students have IT support and tech lending available on the 2nd floor East Wing of Dr. Phillips Academic Commons, in which students can get help troubleshooting issues with their computers and borrow technology like cameras, MacBooks, laptops, cables and more! As always, students must have their ID to check out a device.

A paid printing station is available in the east wing of Dr. Phillips Academic Commons on the 2nd floor. Scanning is also available for free at the station.

The Downtown Library is closed on the weekends. During the Fall and Spring, the library is open Mondays – Thursdays from 8 am to 9 pm and Fridays from 8 am to 5 pm. During the Summer semester, the library is open Mondays – Thursdays from 8 am to 7 pm and Fridays 8 am to 4 pm.
