Research Guides

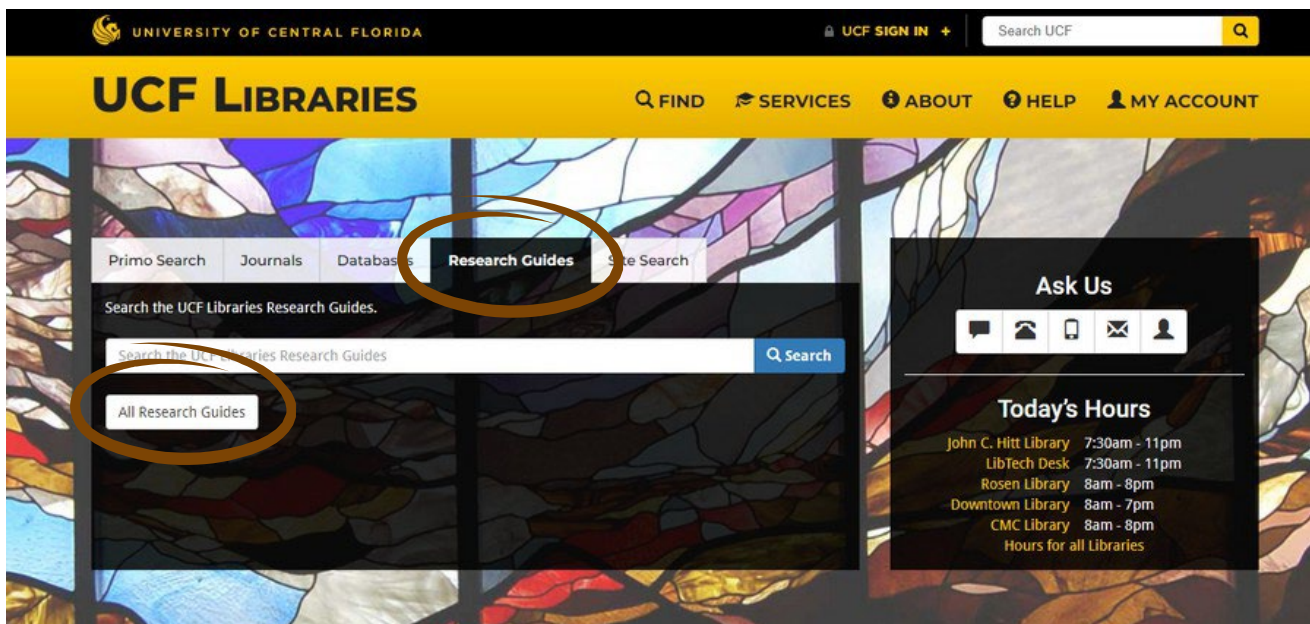
Research is an important aspect of any college career, exposing you to the questions and information that have captured the attention of your field of interest. UCF Libraries has a variety of online resources, specifically designed to support your research assignments.

One such resource are Research Guides. Research Guides can be subject or even course-specific, helping to direct students through the research process.

Research Guides are documented pathways created by UCF librarians to help you locate information, videos, databases, and other resources for your discipline. These documents, also referred as subject guides, course guides, or pathfinders, provide targeted information on a particular topic to support student research needs.

To locate UCF Libraries research guides, first navigate to the UCF Libraries website. Select the "Research Guides" tab and click the "All Research Guides button" This will take you to a list of research guides, organized by subject.

If you'd like to view guides organized by course, click on "Course Guides A-Z."



Clicking on one of the subjects will take you to a list of all of the relevant research guides available in UCF Libraries. These guides have been created by librarians who are experts in particular areas.
