June 27th

My dear Maama ^{you}
Bill told ^{you} I had not been
well I think, you will be glad to
hear I am quite right again now,
but I don't think Bill enjoyed the
nursing part of the business, I
dare say you remember what a
patient & invalid I always was.
Herbert is still with us, but he
is going back to Harcoossee to
work very soon. When you see
M^{rs} Robson next please give her
my love & tell her what I think

of the place and say I have not forgot
that I promised to write to her and
that I mean to soon. I must say I
like the place & the people more &
more, when I was ill Mr^W-Daniel
made me things to eat, beef tea etc
and a friend of Bill's gave me
½ doz of pills to get well again with
and another fellow sent flowers besides
many kind enquiries, it is mostly on
account of Bill, he is a great favorite
out here. It is very warm here now
generally 95- to 98 on the verandah
(the coolest place) every morning, imagine
what it is cooking breakfast, not that
we stay long in the kitchen, we
manage with turned things a

great deal. We are going over to stay
a day or two with the Daniels at
Altamonte (I think I told you they
were moving last time I wrote)
next week. Fancy after all the
fuss Webber's dresses fit better
than any Wallace we made, isn't
it a good thing. I am very glad
you like Marlow, I know the
young Wethereds quite well, I often
danced with all three of them. I
think, two I know for certain, but
they probably would not remember
me. I met two young Arnolds that
know the Weatherbys at Lake
Walton, I liked one but the younger.

one is an awful little beauty. There are
some lemon trees on this grove a
perfect sight, just dragged down
with lemons. Bill was out propping
one tree up as some of the branches
had broken with the weight; there
are water melons too so big. Herbert
has quite a trouble carrying them
into the house, he doesn't find the
same trouble in eating them though.
I am very glad Georgie and the kids
are so well, send her my love when
you next write and thank her of
for her letter. - With love from both
of us and hoping you got Bill's
