Aug 6th

My dear Mamma

Herbert is still over
with the Daniels at Altamonte
about six miles from here,
I am sorry to say he has been
ill with fever, but is getting
over it now, he is not about
yet but will be soon now I
hope, he has not been very
bad only he is very weak, we
have been over there nearly
every day, and Mr Daniel is
taking the greatest care of

him, he has a very fair
appetite so I am sure will soon
be well, I will write again soon
and say how he gets along. It
was such a sad thing about
Mr. Friend's death at Harcoosee
but he ~~would~~ ^{could} not eat food cooked
by himself and wouldn't eat any
body else's, although there are
peaps of houses at Harcoosee
to board at, so he was naturally
very weak before he had fever
at all. This is the only case of
any sickness at all ever known
at Harcoosee, one woman once
had a doctor out there because
she had a baby, & else I don't believe
there was ever one wanted.
