My dear Maria
You will see by the top
that we are in our own house
at last, we left Winter Park
last Saturday week, and stayed
a day & a half in Kessimuc, to
wait for Mr. Raine, (brother to the
one in Virginia Virginia) he came
with us out to Mancossee and
helped us put things straight, we
are getting a little straighter
now I am glad to say, Mr. Raine

was very nice and we missed him
very much when he left last
Monday. The butcher comes four
times a week, and the ice man
three times and in ten days
we are to have fresh milk every
day, so no one can rough it at
Percoossee any longer. This is a
very comfortable little house, but
we were nearly eaten up by
mosquitoes until today when the
wire was arrived, Bill put them
up at once and we are left in peace
tonight. Herbert is still at the
Daniels, but I heard he was
seen in Orlando this week, 20

I expect he is quite strong again.
Thanks very much for the Bray Regatta
Liner, what a horrible thing it was
about those drowning women, I
heard from Matthew this week of
Mary Watney besides the Marlow
letters so we had lots of news.
Does your gardener at Marlow
still grow those long cucumbers,
I would like some good seed very
much all the cucumbers that
grow here are nearly round, and
I know the english seed does well
here because Mr Davidson tried it.
I am always thinking of writing
to Dicky Moore to ask him if there

is any reliable ~~to~~ books on growing
ordinary vegetables, we have
plenty of ground, but nobody here
knows how to grow a cabbage or
a lettuce properly, if you ever
see old Dicky ask him from me
for the sake of old times to think
of some book or other that would
help us, I shall very likely write
to him and if I did, would you
order the book for me as quickly
as possible, I might not be able to
get it out here, but please don't
think of paying for it. Bill is
going to write very soon he says.
