your last letter. I am sorry
you did not get my
letter, I know it was a long
one principally trying to
reassure you about the
Haida climate. Who
spread the report that
Friend died of Yellow
Fever must have a most
inductive ^{mind} ~~man~~. It has
never been heard of in

Amos on the Coast for years.
I need not say how glad
I shall be when the next few
months are safely over.
Allen & I will go to Orlando
the beginning of March. We
were going to the banks for
Xmas, but Miss Ward will
be with us, and I think
both of us would rather
cheer our first Xmas in
our own home. I am going
to cross the Country in Search
of a Turkey & failing must
hunt up a wild one. The
Steam boat is at last on
the Lake & I hope will run
regularly next week. Lookers

three more houses going up
close here to the King built
all over the Colony. We bought
a very fine mare last week,
wh. I hope will be the means
of adding born Copper; as
there is no end of work here
for a horse and boy on;
besides ploughing. The boys
are looking very well in
quite often or three frocks
we have had at night. The
value of land has gone up
75 percent since I came
out, to this place, I hope it
will keep on at that rate.

Herbert is very well and
quite happy at the Daniels.

We are hoping to come home,
the summer after next for a
few months. Please give my
love to all yours and with
the same to yourself and every
good wish for Xmas & the
New Year.
