Jan 29th

My dear Maama

I am awfully sorry for poor little Gladys, I expect nurse is pretty mad too, have you taken her to see Quain (I forget if the old man is still alive or not, a mere detail of course), he cured Clara of that eruption on her mouth years ago I remember, perhaps he could manage Gladys, we had something of the sort when we first came to Karocsee, and it left a little red patch on Bill's chin you can only see it when he is very hot and I dare say it will gradually

fade right away; we never did anything
to it; it went away by itself; I shall go
mad if "little lumpy" (that's what we
call it) gets anything of the sort.

Bill bought such a buggy last
week; it will be very useful by
and by, and the mare goes very
well now, I wish you could see
the whole turn out, it is fit for
anywhere - Please give Bertha
my love and say I will ~~or~~ write to
her next time, why is it Alice
never writes, I suppose the boys are as
much as she can manage in the
letter line - Fancy I heard from
Rose this week, and she ^{is} going to
send me out some of Peter's baby
clothes, enough she hopes for the

little lumpy so that I needn't
worry about making any more for
a bit, isn't it awfully kind of her;
I am going to make it four doz. diapers
at once and if it wants more I can
do it ~~then~~ afterwards. Bill has
gone to dig out some marsh land,
we make the bottom of the mare's stable
with it and it keeps her feet cool, they
get awfully hard if she is always on
sand, and when she has trodden
it about, it is just splendid to put
round the orange trees. My lettuces
are coming on well, and we planted
about a dozen mulberry sticks out round
the house about ten days ago and
they are shooting already. We have
heard all sorts of things about that

man Silver, he comes from a very
bad lot, so I shall not have anything
more to do with either of them,
With love from both of us.
