April 19th 18th

My dear Mamma

I got your letter last week.

The little one has not put in an appearance yet although the time (as near as any one can tell) was up on 15th, it can't be very far off, as I have had a good deal of back ache this morning. I saw the nurse the other evening an enormous woman, as black as a coal, but very clean and they say

she is a very good one - Bill & Herbert have driven over to Altamonte today, I wish I could get the affair over before they come back tonight; Bill is very anxious to have it all over and alright. I hate being in here, it is so frightfully slow, nothing whatever to do, I bought some lawn and lace, and have made two such pretty little bonnets, Rose sent me a very nice silk hood for best, but ~~the~~ ^{these} others will wash. I wish you could see them I cut them out and ~~cut~~ everything all by myself. The boys are going to begin running the

boat regularly, on Thursday,
so Bill will only be able to stay
here from Sat. till Monday every
week, of course he could come
if I wired for him at any time,
he doesn't like leaving me, but
he can't do any good here, and
perhaps it will be here by
Thursday. No news. Best love to all
the others.
