My dear Mamma

Another month was up yesterday, so I suppose I may expect it to arrive in one of the next few days, it does not feel much like it today, but I dare say it will not take long once it really starts, It is very hot here today, quite as warm as in the middle of the summer - Bill & Herbert came here last Saturday till Monday, this makes the third week since they first left me here alone. The two Mr^s Daniels are coming in to do some shopping on Friday, and

they are going to bring the baby in too, I have promised to take care of it while they are busy, I want to get used to holding a baby before my own arrives, I would rather practice on somebody else's. How is Gladys and when am I to have her photo, she must be very much altered, I wish she could be out here for a year, she would get so strong, all the children one sees here are so fat and big as a rule, they never seemed to be pulled down at all by the long summer, Mr Watson's little girl that came out to Harcoosee last Oct, is nearly half as big again as she was when she came and certainly much fatter & stronger - I have been very

busy making myself ~~two~~ two
very cool and cheap morning
dresses, it is in the early
morning that I feel the heat
most. M^{rs} Matthews lends me
her sewing machine so it is
not much trouble to make
them - Did I tell you M^{rs} Fell
has gone to live out at Harcoosee
