April 3<sup>rd</sup>

My dear Mamma

You will be glad to hear, Bill has got some work, it is a good deal better than nothing although he only expects it to last a fortnight, but I hope when that job is done he may be able to get another without waiting so long as this time, if he gets plenty of work this summer, we hope to come back to see you all again in the winter, but of

course it is very uncertain, but  
of supposing he is doing nothing  
and no chance of any work to  
look forward to, I should not be  
surprised if we went to British  
Columbia, there are several people  
going <sup>there</sup> from here and if they ~~and~~  
write back good reports we would  
go, it is over 4,000 miles off and  
takes 7 days to get there so I do  
not look forward to going much  
but anything is better than  
Bill having no work to do, of  
course if we went there it would  
be a long time before we went

back to England. Rubie has cut a  
great big (stomach tooth they call  
it), she was very ill & feverish  
all one day before it came through  
and I was frightened to death,  
but she is alright again now.

Of course the idiot that was going  
to buy our grave has changed his  
mind and I am afraid won't  
take it now. I had baby vaccinated  
again yesterday but I can't see  
yet if it has taken. I think a  
great deal about George, I wonder  
if her trouble is all over yet,  
I do hope it is a boy to make up  
for all her worry. Do remember  
I told you about a Major Campbell

who was out here and went  
back to England on business &  
short time ago, there is a terrible  
case against him, taking trust  
money etc; it seems impossible  
and I hope he will be able to  
explain it all; have you seen  
anything in the papers about it  
Major Leighton Campbell is his  
name, if you do send the paper  
on to us, he was very kind to  
Bill while he was out here -
