April 9<sup>th</sup>

My dear Maama

I am afraid all my ideas of getting back next winter will never come to anything; we thought Bill had something at last, but the job was done in two days, he wants to stay on here all this summer he says he thinks he will get work, but I am not so hopeful and want him to go <sup>to</sup> some other place, a little more likely, there is no work going on here at all. He has taken two fellows down the river in a sail-boat for ten days at 4 dollars a day, but as he has had to hire

the boat, he won't get it all. There is  
a man named Hall going to British  
Columbia next week, and he is  
going to write and tell us what  
it is like. Fancy first class to England  
this summer from Orlando for 30 dollars  
(seven pounds), I wish we had made  
a few cents this winter and we should  
have come back for a month or two.  
Bill is anxious I should go with Rubie  
and leave him here to get along by  
himself, but I'm not going to do it  
for fifty Englands. Rubie can almost  
walk, she stands up against chairs  
and things all the time, she is very  
well but cutting a lot of teeth all at  
once, so of course very cross. We have  
one cutting from a paper about

Major Campbell, but nothing seemed  
to be proved but a letter he ~~wrote~~ saying  
he would crace something down someone's  
throat, not <sup>a</sup> very pretty letter but  
hardly worth going to law about;  
I hope what was said about taking  
the money was not true, that would  
be quite a different thing. I am  
very anxious to hear about Georgie,  
the baby must be here by this time,  
poor old girl, what a lot of trouble  
she has had, always someone ill,  
if not herself, it is Percy - How is  
Herbert, he does not write very often,  
but I know he is busy. Thank you  
very much for the prescription, I  
have sent it on to my friend, she left  
here about two weeks ago -

I suppose Ticky & Hugh are home for the  
holidays, it is Easter Sunday today,  
please give them my love.
