May 15th

My dear Maama

Thank you for telling
me about Genzie's baby,

Georgia, it would not be very
expensive getting there and
I dare say work is as likely to
be had there as anywhere -

I hope to get our bundle of
things this week, Willie
Nairne started on April 29th.
Tom was very good about the
money, he sent it off on the 16th
but they never said a word
at the Bank when it arrived
until Bill happened to go
there to enquire about it.
Please give my love to all
of them, at home -

We have had several bad
thunder storms lately, one
boat on the lake was struck;
it split the mast and made
a hole in her bottom, luckily
no one was in her at the
time. Bill sends his love.
