Mr. Caldwell: Mr. President, to represent the faculty the Trustees have selected two candidates. The first is Winter Park's pioneer artist. Educated in the schools of Boston, graduating from Massachusetts Normal Art School and the Osgood Art School, she joined the Rollins faculty in the fall of 1886, one year after the founding of the College, and as organizer of the Art Department, remained in charge for twelve years, serving under President Hooker, President Ward and President Blackman. Her salary was exactly - nothing. The College permitted her, however, to charge fees to the winter hotel guests who joined her classes, from which she sometimes earned \$25 a year. Thus again was proved the charge that yesterday as well as today the stipend of the college professor can be discharged in postage stamps. In behalf of the Trustees I present to you for the Rollins Decoration of Honor, Alice Ellen Guild of Winter Park.
