The Rogers House

Winter Park, Florida

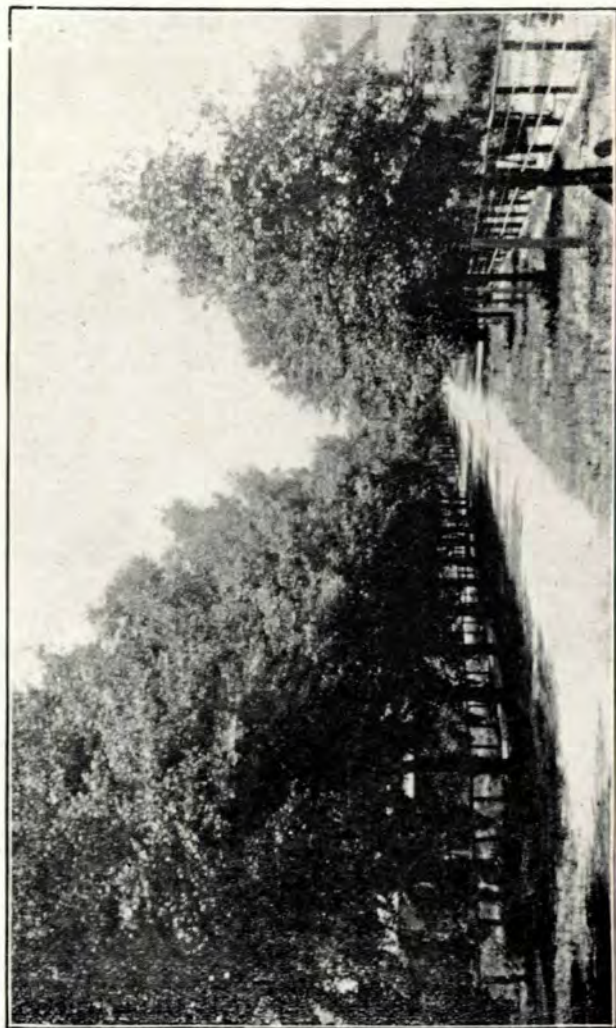

The house is well furnished throughout. Verandas extend on three sides. The rooms are of good size; well lighted, and well ventilated. The beds are furnished with upholstered box springs and heavy curled hair mattresses.

The house is well built and warmed in parlors and office by open wood and coal fires, and by air tight stoves in the sleeping rooms. It is supplied on each floor with perfectly pure soft water from driven wells, and has a perfect system of drainage.

Good sidewalks extend in various directions about the town. There are many lovely drives around the lakes, through the pine woods, hammocks and orange groves. Good saddle and driving horses can be obtained at the livery near by. Good iron clay roads extend through the town, around the lakes, and form a "belt line" to Orlando, four miles south; also to Sanford, on the St. Johns River, seventeen miles north. Many bicycle paths are also made in various directions through the pine woods to other towns, adding greatly to the charm of cycling. One of the finest golf courses in Florida, adds this select sport to the attractions of the place.
