Course Name: Conversation in French

This course is intended for students who have taken FRN 102 and/or higher level French courses. The purpose of the course is to develop the students' ability to speak French. Participants will read a wide variety of texts, excerpts from French magazines, and short stories, and will talk about them. In addition to the texts, the vocabulary learned in the 100-level course will be reviewed and greatly expanded by topics at each session, which will lead to various discussions. Once or twice a week students will listen to a variety of recordings—including songs—which will improve their listening comprehension. Every day participants will be asked to prepare written dialogues in groups, which they will then enact in class, and they will also have to give short, prepared talks on an individual basis.
