THE KISSIMMEE is pleasantly located, facing Lake Tohopekaliga, the first of a large series of lakes on which one may go 300 miles without disembarking, and a trip from Kissimmee to Fort Meyers on one of the steamers plying the lakes is well worth taking. The town of Kissimmee is on the Atlantic Coast Line R. R., between Jacksonville and Tampa, 160 miles south of Jacksonville and 75 miles northeast of Tampa.

There is as good hunting as in any part of Florida, which is saying a great deal. Quail and snipe may be found in great numbers within three hours ride from the hotel. Ducks, Wild Turkey and Deer await the skillful and industrious hunter.



...Fishing...



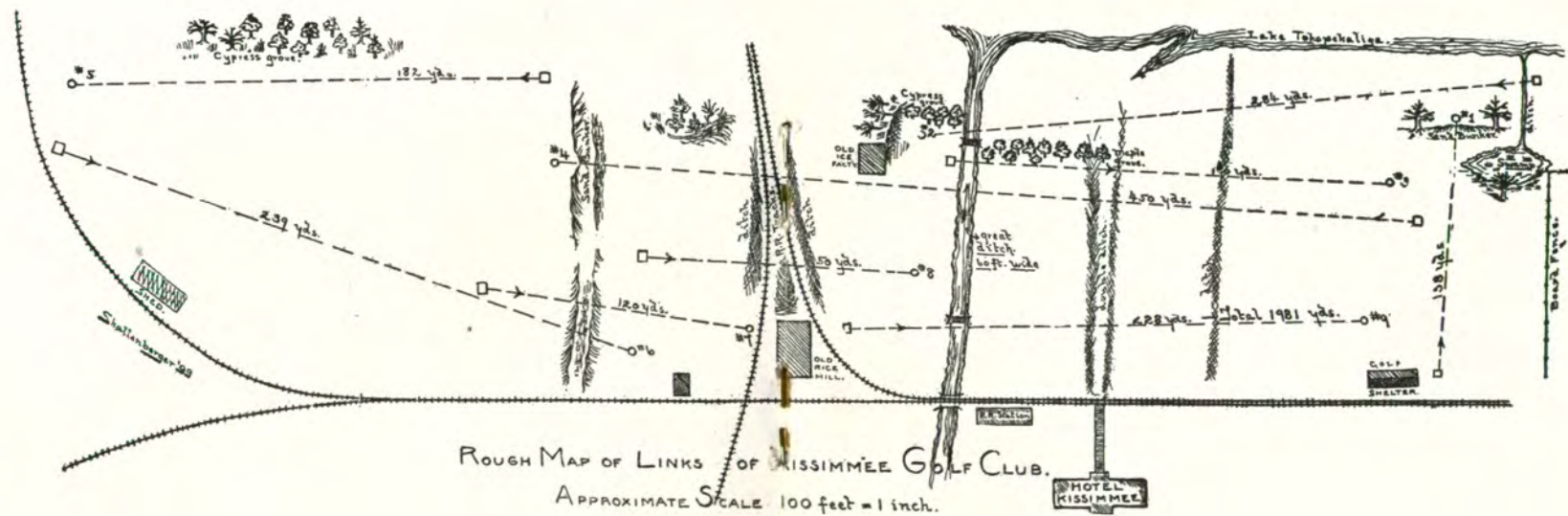

...Golf...

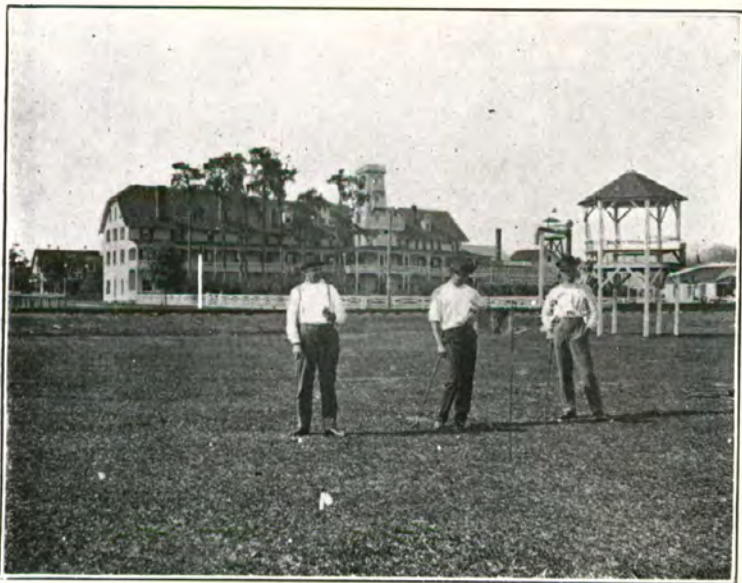
