## Presidential Candidates

### George Westwood

To answer the question some of you may be asking, I will be an undergraduate for another year due to a change in my academic objectives.

I will address myself basically to two points: 1) qualification and motivation, and 2) goals and objectives.



I have served on each of the three main organizations of the Student Association - the Student Assembly (2 years), the Student Center Board of Directors (1 term), and the Student Court (3 years). In addition, I have served on College Preparation Week (3 years), the Student Center for Social Concerns (1 year), and the ad-hoc committee to study referendum and Assembly procedure (a committee which was formed on my motion to the Assembly). This year I have also served as an officer of the Lambda fraternity. These experiences have exposed me to a broad spectrum of involvement and awareness with student government and concerns. I believe the president should have a confident and thorough "feeling" for what is going on rather than use the "learn as you go" technique. As per my motivation, I have what could best be termed a love for Rollins; yet I can note its limitations. How many of you have used the phrase, "Rollins sure has a lot of potential!"? Well, this potential is within us, and only we can bring it out. I am dedicated to improving Rollins both academically and socially. An example of my concern is I helped initiate and since the beginning of Spring term have attended eleven hours worth of meetings with Dean Pease, Dean Russell, Dean Campbell, Vice-Provost Griffin, Sister Kate, and Judy Provost in an effort to make instrumental changes in RA education and College Preparation Week. I initiated these meetings with neither recognition from the Student Association nor something to "put on the transcript". I did it because of my concern for Rollins. I cite the above example

to show my motives are intrinsic rather than extrinsic.

Concerning my objectives, I have many, and space can permit me to mention but a few. I believe the Assembly is an appropriate method of democratic student government. However, the present system of electing the membership gives some houses over and others under representation. I will have this system reviewed to come up with a more viable and representative Assembly by next year. Also, I have been very disappointed with attendance at the Assembly meetings. Since Assembly membership is an elected position which can be declined, I would demand a maximum of two unexcused absences per year with a five dollar fine being imposed for each absence after that or a resignation from the position.

In addition to the Assembly, I would recommend the formation of an "executive council" consisting of the president, vice-president, and treasure of the Student Association, the Chairperson of the Student Court, the president and treasure of the Student Center, the presidents of IFC and Panhell, two independent representatives from the Assembly, and the editor of the "Sandspur". This council would be a great asset for the discussion and coordination of activities on campus.

My experience at Rollins has shown that of the three major groups on campus (administration, faculty, students) the faculty is the most powerful and yet seems autonomous. I would propose a faculty review board be initiated consisting solely of students. This board would represent the student opinion on such topics as tenure, termination, and performance of faculty members.

I have often heard of the concern about the communication gap between the Rollins student and the student government. In order to bridge that gap I will re-institute the college forum, where the whole student body can come together in a social atmosphere to discuss relevant social and academic problems with faculty, administration, and amongst themselves. Each meeting of the forum will be in a different house on campus in an effort to help bring our community even more together.

I have lived in both alternative housing (Pinehurst) and Greek housing (Lambda). I believe both can exist harmoniously on campus. However, a fair method of allocation of housing must be found and possibly the pressuring of the college to build more small housing units on campus.

Rollins is in the process of improving its academic character (recent legislation moved to have

Too often, at Rollins, policy is formulated and changes come about with little or no student input and awareness. The result is that we can only react to these changes rather than have a say in the direction of them. Apathy is a problem at Rollins, and the performance of the Student Government has been hindered by this attitude. To blame the lack of student involvement on apathy along, however, is too easy. Communication between the student body and student representatives must be increased to make the Student Government more representative and responsive to our needs. Student opinions must be solicited through responsible representatives. At present, the attendance at the weekly Student Assembly meetings barely reaches the minimum quorum of 25%. The Student Assembly is responsible to the students and should be required to represent us fully. The required minimum attendance to constitute a quorum should be increased at least to 51%. The duties of the representatives must be emphasized from the outset. The Student Assembly can be an effective form of government. The Assembly meetings are open to all and students should be encouraged to attend. The meetings can become more of a school-wide

the minimum GPA raised to 7.0); however, little is done to help improve the social situation at this college, and yet social reasons are the main cause of transfer from Rollins. Social and academic aspects of college are not separate entities but go hand in hand. We can not improve one without improving the other.

I have had experience in each branch of student government at Rollins. I hope you will let me put my experience to work for you with your vote. However, no matter who your favorite candidate is, please vote. Let's Get Involved!!

forum and important issues such as visitation, the Student Court, the performance of security and teacher evaluation should be discussed. Only then can the President truly voice the student opinion in representing the entire student body with the Board of Trustees, the Administration and the Faculty, in addition to directing a rational application of the Student Association funds in the best interest of the students.

A major concern at Rollins is faculty evaluation. To whom can we complain when we feel that a teacher is not performing effectively, or if we feel that we have been treated unfairly? Currently teacher evaluation is carried out by the Standing Committee on Professional Development, which is the only committee with **no voting student members**. Once a teacher has been at Rollins for a few years and has acquired tenure, which the large majority have, he is evaluated only once every four years unless a committee or school official requests it. In order for a student to register a complaint he must possibly jeopardize himself by complaining to a department head or a member of the Administration. Rarely does significant change come about. A **student advisory panel** to the Professional Development Committee should be created to voice our views and to act as a grievance board for students. Needless problems also occur because visitation regulations are **too rigid**. We are capable adults and responsible enough to decide our own moral preferences. Hours of visitation should be voted upon by the members of each dorm, with twenty-four hour visitation being an option.

The size and structure of Rollins enables us to maintain close contact and interaction with the Administration and the Board of Trustees. Our ideas, opinions and grievances will be considered if they are presented effectively. I will represent you through my ability and experience, with an attitude for constructive change and the dedication to be your President. I appreciate your support on March 17 and 18.

# Vice--Presidential Candidates

The Student Government at Rollins is a self-governing organization designed to promote the diverse interests of the student body. Consequently, input from students, individually and collectively, is vital for the effectiveness of the programs. The Student Association budget of over \$90,000 merits the close scrutiny of your representatives. It is therefore necessary for the Association to exercise fiscal responsibility in allocating the budget.

As an active member of the Student Assembly I recognize the value of a well informed student body. Thus the existing quorum of 25% for Student Association meetings should be increased to 51% to insure that a majority of the representatives are present to vote on legislation. It has been my observation this year that the underclassmen and transfers have not been adequately informed as to the functions of our government. College Preparation Week would provide the means for informing new students as to the duties and responsibilities of the Student Government. In turn this would provide a new channel for fresh

ideas and greater involvement. This year the publication of the Student Association's minutes in the **Sandspur** has aided in informing the students of their government's activities but has failed to impress upon the student body that the entire campus is welcome to any meeting.

Many students have expressed dissatisfaction with the visitation guidelines. Although coed housing thus far has been beneficial it's not for everyone. Twenty-four hour visitation, however, would be beneficial to Rollins if each dormitory could adopt its own visitation policy. Once security arrangements can be established to make each student comfortable, a self-determined visitation policy would create more natural living arrangements on campus.

The issues are real and can't be resolved unless we the students challenge them. Only through the communication and active participation of the students can the full extent of the Student Government be recognized. As an officer in my fraternity this year I've had opportunities to deal with the administration regularly. I'm confident of my ability to handle responsibility and deal effectively with the administration, faculty, and trustees. Give me the opportunity to be your vice-president, vote on March 17th and 18th and become involved. Thank you.
