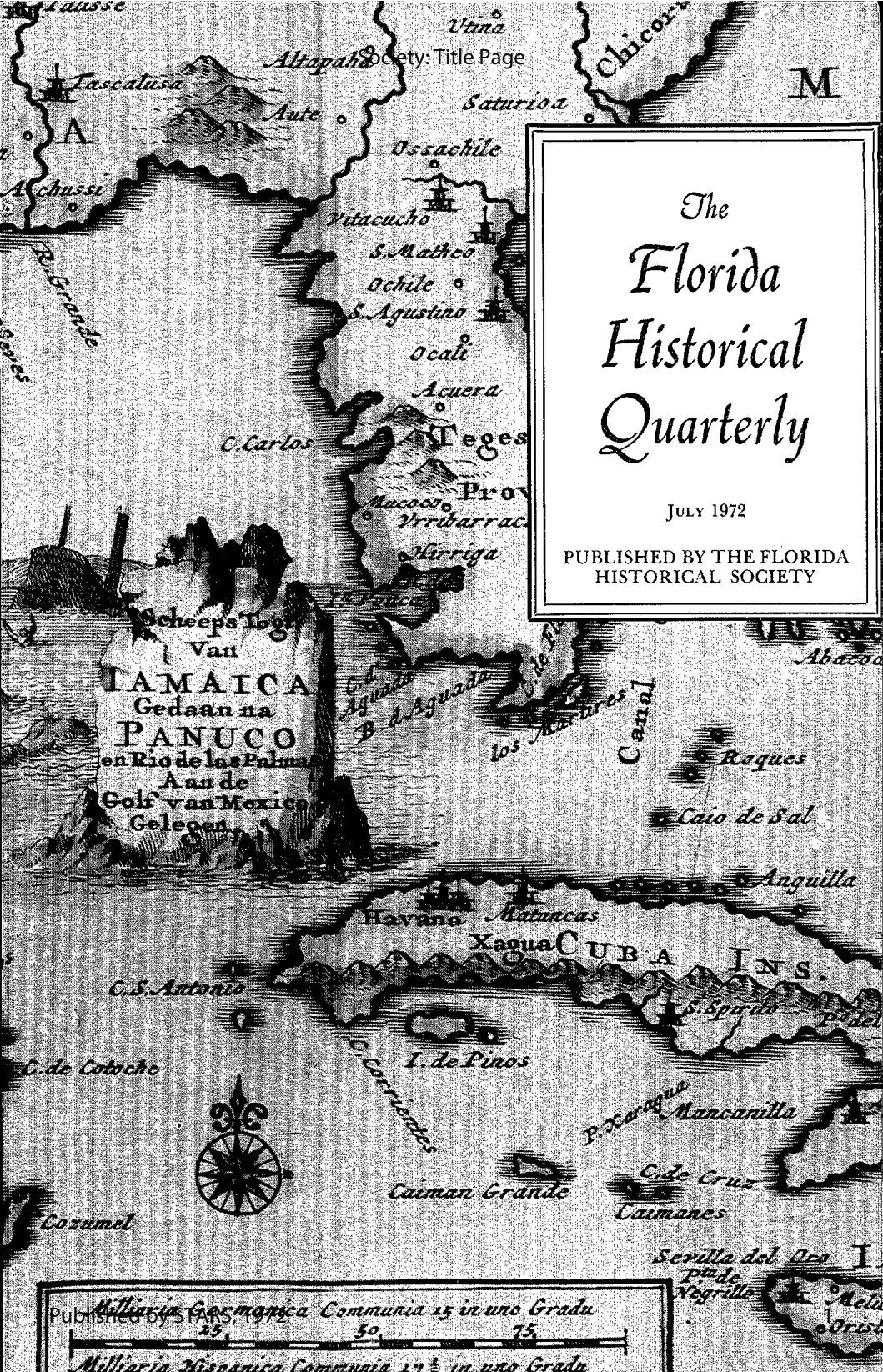

COVER

“Scheeps Togt Van Jamaica na Panuco en Rio de las Palmas A an de Golf van Mexico Gelegen” was drawn in 1714 by Pieter Vander Aa (1659-1733), the well-known Dutch cartographer. His major works came in the wake of the golden age of Dutch cartography which lasted from 1570 to 1670. During this period, Dutch maps were in great demand; they were considered to be the most accurate, best decorated, and richest in artistic presence. Displaying the same energy that Dutch traders and merchants evinced in the late sixteenth and early seventeenth centuries, Dutch cartographers, including Mercator, Ortelius, and Blaeu, captured the world market in maps and atlases.

Vander Aa's best known work was a 1729 atlas, *Galerie Agréable du Monde*, a sixty-six-volume collection of 3,000 maps and views. It was of limited circulation; only 100 copies were printed. His other works included *Atlas Nouvel*, a collection of ninety-eight maps published in 1714, and *Atlas Nouveau et Curieux*, a collection of 139 maps which appeared that same year. The map reproduced here is in the collection of the P. K. Library of Florida History, University of Florida, Gainesville.
