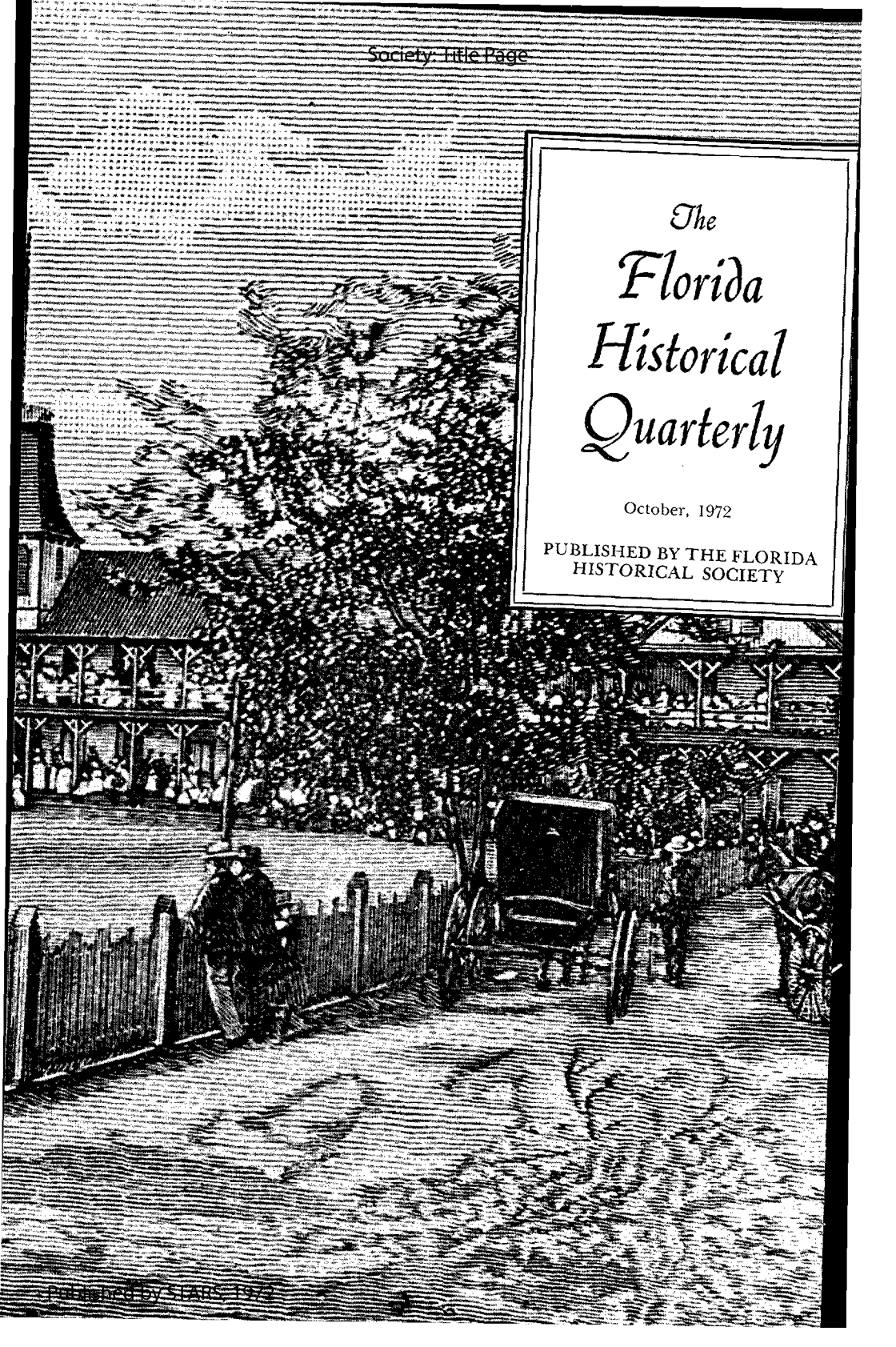

COVER

The East Florida Seminary, the oldest parent of the University of Florida, was established in Ocala, January 1853. It was transferred to Gainesville in 1866, merging with a small local school. It was a coeducational institution, and college degrees began to be conferred in 1882. The seminary operated as a semi-military school, at least for its male students. They wore uniforms, drilled regularly, referred to their dormitory as a barracks, and were awakened each morning by a bugle call.

This is a copy of a photograph taken in the 1890s showing the cadets' weekly dress parade in front of the barracks. Townspeople are seated on the piazzas. The two-story brick building to the left still stands; it is the Epworth Hall of the First Methodist Church on Northeast First Street. The parade ground is presently a city park.
