Fort Myers, intersection of Bay and Lee streets, in the early 1930s. This photograph looks north across the Caloosahatchee River and the Edison Memorial Bridge. Hidden by foliage on the right is the Royal Palm Hotel, built by Hugh O'Neill. The Royal Palm Annex is the large building in the center; the two small buildings in the right foreground, on Lee Street, are boom-era real estate offices. The building on the far left served as staff headquarters for the U. S. Army during the Second Seminole War. By the time of this photograph it had been moved and it housed the Fort Myers Library.
