

COVER

Faber & Co. was one of the largest pencil manufacturers in the world in the nineteenth century. Only Florida red cedar was used in the production of the more than 590 varieties of pencils. Over 1,000,000 cubic board feet of finished lumber was exported annually, making Cedar Key a very bustling seaport. The cedar was processed into pencils and pencil boxes in the north and in Europe.

This view of the assembly of the log rafts used to bring the rough timber into Cedar Key was sketched by Samuel B. W. Benjamin (1837-1914). It appeared in *Harper's Weekly*, May 13, 1882. Benjamin was a popular artist in the 1870s and 1880s, and many of his sketches of Florida appeared in national magazines.
