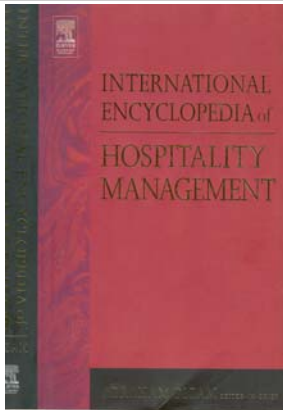

Dr. Pizam Edits New Encyclopedia

From now on, when students need an authoritative source on all things hospitality, they can turn to a familiar name.

Dr. Abraham Pizam, Dean of the UCF Rosen College of Hospitality Management, is the Chief Editor of the new International Encyclopedia of Hospitality Management (Elsevier, 2005). A leading expert in the field, Pizam enlisted the support of more than 200 different authors from around the world to produce what he describes as "a serious attempt to describe, define, and analyze the major issues relevant to the international and multi-sectoral hospitality industry."

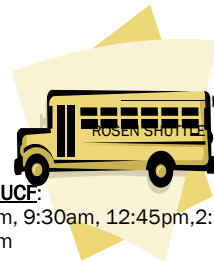
Among the contributors were fellow Rosen College faculty members Deborah Breiter, Bill Fisher, Tammie Kaufman, Stephen LeBruto, Christopher Muller, Kim Severt, and Randall Upchurch.

With entries ranging from à la carte to zoning codes, and touching on the major sectors of the industry (e.g., foodservice, lodging, special events) as well as the major managerial disciplines (e.g., accounting, human resources, marketing), the one-volume encyclopedia offers something for every hospitality student. Each entry is signed by the author and includes references for further study. All in all, the International Encyclopedia of Hospitality Management will serve as an indispensable reference for the study of hospitality management.
